1st/2nd Declension Adjectives:			
-us, -a, -um (<i>laetus, -a, -um</i>)	<i>laetus, -a, -um</i>	<i>laetior, laetius</i>	<i>laetissimus, -a, -um</i>
-er, -a, -um (<i>pulcher, -chra, -chrum</i>)	<i>pulcher, pulchra, pulchrum</i>	<i>pulchrior, -ius</i>	<i>pulcherrimus, -a, -um</i>
3rd Declension Adjectives:			
-is, -is, -e adjectives (<i>fortis, -is, -e</i>)	<i>fortis, -is, -e</i>	<i>fortior, fortius</i>	<i>fortissimus, -a, -um</i>
-er, -is, -e adjectives (<i>celer, celeris, celere</i>)	<i>celer, celeris, celere</i>	<i>celerior, celerius</i>	<i>celerrimus, -a, -um</i>
Other 3rd Declension Adj:			
<i>ingens, ingentis</i> (stem = <i>ingent-</i>)	<i>ingēns, ingentis</i>	<i>ingentior, -ius</i>	<i>ingentissimus, -a, -um</i>
<i>procax, prōcācis</i> (stem = <i>prōcāc-</i>)	<i>procax, procācis</i>	<i>procācior, -ius</i>	<i>procācissimus, -a, -um</i>
Note about 3rd declension adjectives ending in -lis:			
Most are normal:	<i>fidēlis</i>	<i>fidēlior</i>	<i>fidelissimus</i>
But the following six have superlatives ending in <i>-illimus</i> , not <i>-issimus</i> .			
<i>facilis</i>	<i>facilis, -is, -e</i>	<i>facilior, -ius</i>	<i>facillimus, -a, -um</i>
<i>difficilis</i>	<i>difficilis, -is, -e</i>	<i>difficilior, -ius</i>	<i>difficillimus, -a, -um</i>
<i>similis</i>	<i>similis, -is, -e</i>	<i>similior, -ius</i>	<i>simillimus, -a, -um</i>
<i>dissimilis</i>	<i>dissimilis, -is, -e</i>	<i>dissimilior, -ius</i>	<i>dissimillimus, -a, -um</i>
<i>gracilis</i>	<i>gracilis, -is, -e</i>	<i>gracilior, -ius</i>	<i>gracillimus, -a, -um</i>
<i>humilis</i>	<i>humilis, -is, -e</i>	<i>humilior, -ius</i>	<i>humillimus, -a, -um</i>
