Verbs of Thinking or Knowing

putō, putāre, putāvī, putātus - to think

crēdō, crēdere, crēdidī, crēditus - to believe, trust

sciō, scīre, scīvī, scītus - to know

sperō, sperāre, sperāvī, sperātus - to hope, expect

prō certō habeō (habeō, habēre, habuī, habitus) - to be sure, be certain

cōnstat - it is agreed

Verbs of Perceiving

videō, vidēre, vīdī, vīsus - to see

audiō, audīre, audīvī, audītus - to hear

sentiō, sentīre, sēnsī, sēnsus - to sense, feel

Verbs of Saying

dīcō, dīcere, dīxī, dictus - to say, speak, tell

respondeō, respondēre, respondī, respōnsus - to reply, respond

nūntiō, nūntiāre, nūntiāvī, nūntiātus - to announce

negō, negāre, negāvī, negātus - to deny
