

## Subjunctives of Irregular Verbs

Below are synopses of irregular verbs in the subjunctive. The present tense is the only tense that is truly irregular; the rest of the tenses form the subjunctive according to the normal rules. *Fiō* is different in that it behaves like a semi-deponent. *Ferō* is the only one with both active and passive forms.

### sum, esse, fuī, futūrus

Present:	sim
Imperfect:	essem
Perfect:	fuerim
Pluperfect:	fuissem

### mālō, mālle, māluī, ---

Present:	mālim
Imperfect:	māllem
Perfect:	māluerim
Pluperfect:	māluissem

### possum, posse, potuī, ---

Present:	possim
Imperfect:	possem
Perfect:	potuerim
Pluperfect:	potuissem

### eō, ire, iī/ivī, itūrus

Present:	eam
Imperfect:	īrem
Perfect:	ierim / īverim
Pluperfect:	iissem / īvissem

### volō, velle, voluī, ---

Present:	velim
Imperfect:	vellem
Perfect:	voluerim
Pluperfect:	voluissem

### ferō, ferre, tulī, lātus

Present:	feram	ferar
Imperfect:	ferrem	ferrer
Perfect:	tulerim	lātus sim
Pluperfect:	tulisse	lātus essem

### nōlō, nōlle, nōluī, ---

Present:	nōlim
Imperfect:	nōllem
Perfect:	nōluerim
Pluperfect:	nōluissem

### fiō, fierī, factus sum

Present:	fiam
Imperfect:	fierem
Perfect:	factus sim
Pluperfect:	factus essem
